Youth- Involved Data Sources

Calls for Service (CFS): Any 911 call for service or CAD activity where the caller or officer noted youth “keywords”. This largely reflects disorder as it does not require a burden of proof.

Reported Crime/Shooting: Criminal incidents reported to CPD with at least one victim, witness, suspect, or arrestee under the age of 18. Shootings only include youth victim, not perpetrators.

Arrest: A physical arrest of a person under the age of 18, including a warrant service. Note the location of arrest is not necessarily the location of offense.

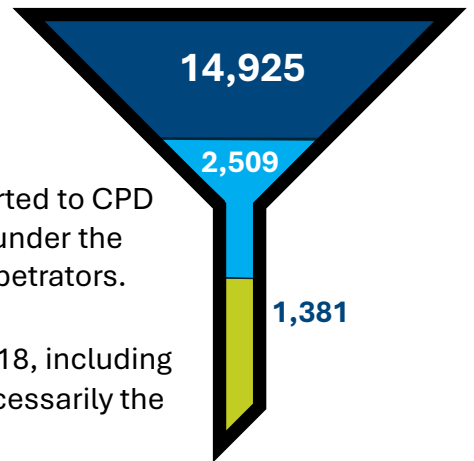

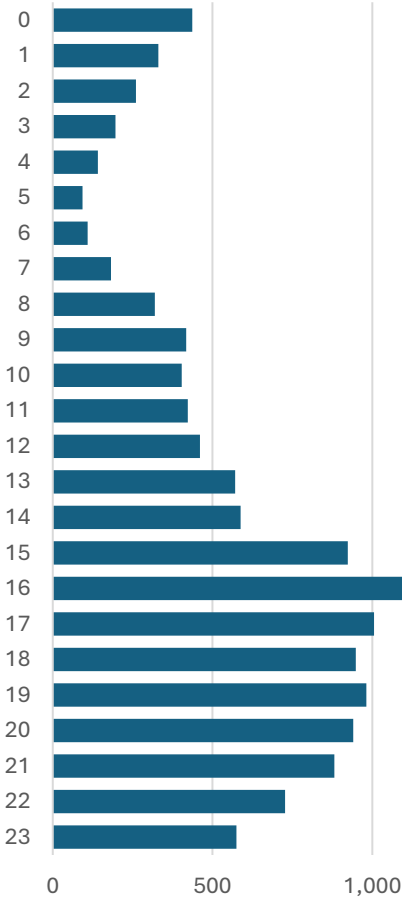

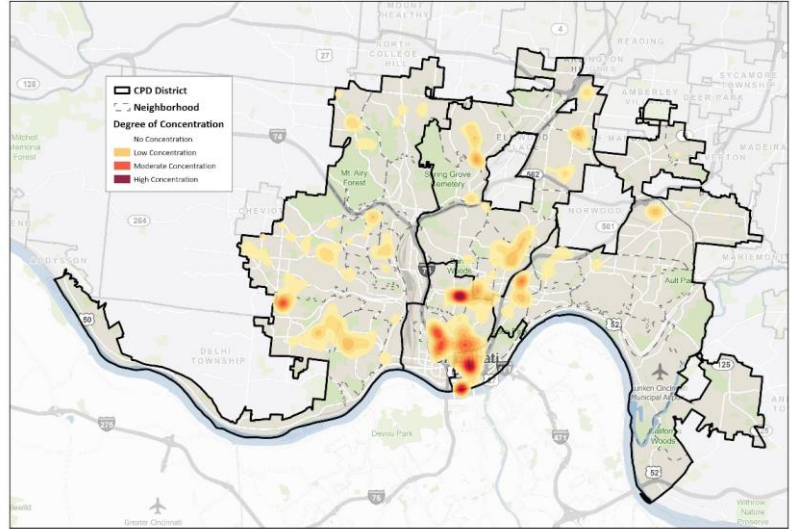
Overview

Youth-Involved CFS, which represents general disorder, concentrate spatially (around major activity spots) and temporally (after school hours).

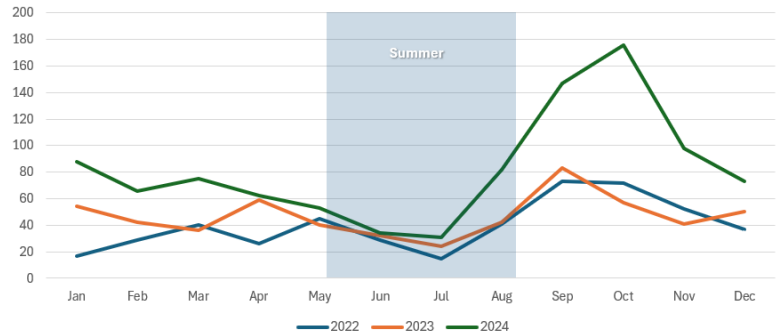
Youth-Related Calls By Hour of Day, 2024

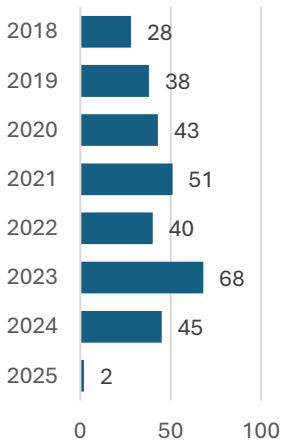

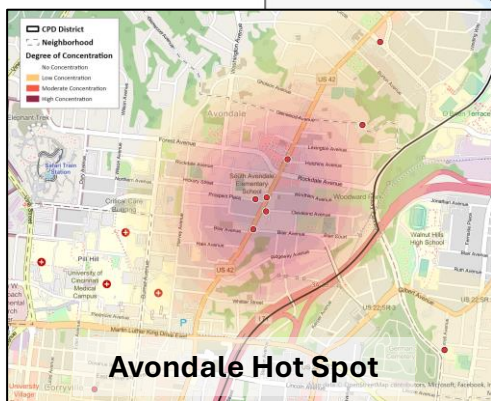
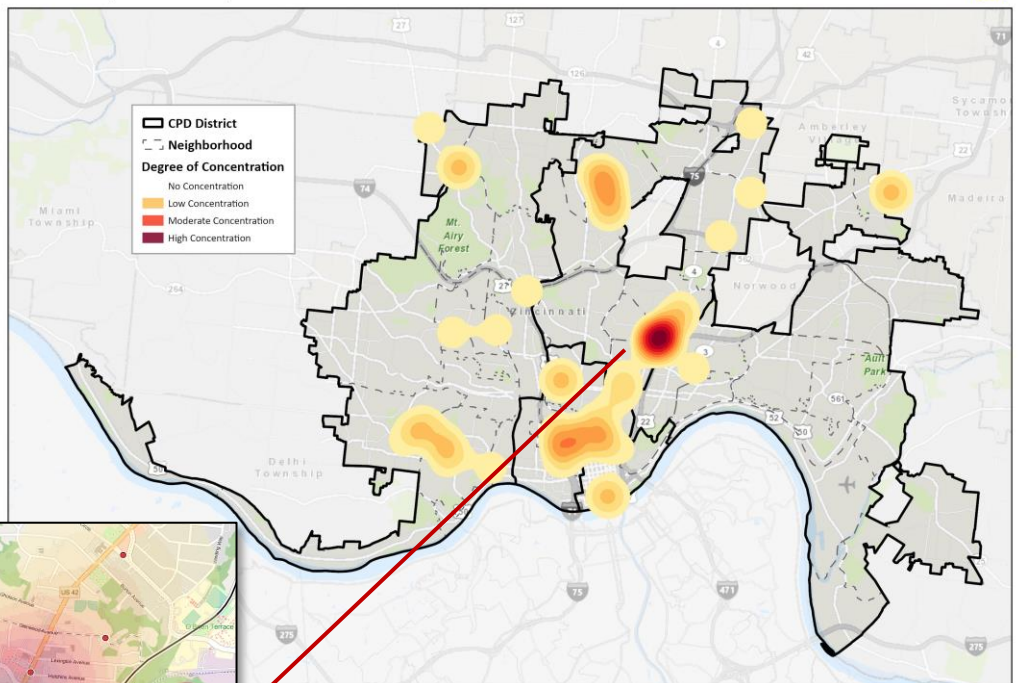

Full Year: January 1 - December 31, 2024



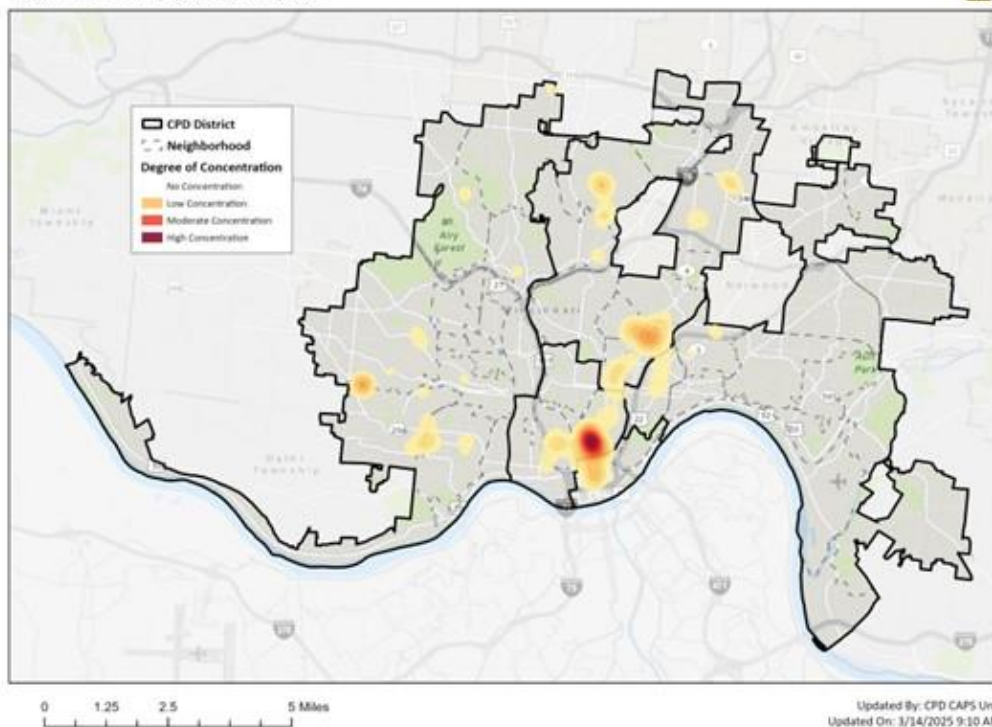
